**DEADLINE THURSDAY**  
Deadline for the filing of nominating petitions has been set for this Thursday, November 30, at 6:00 p.m. Petitions must be filed with the City Clerk at the Municipal Building. Persons not already registered in the City may do so at the Municipal Building any week from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. or on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 12 noon. On the last day of registration, Wednesday, December 13, persons may register from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. with the City Clerk at the Municipal Building.  
The election January 2 will name members of the Charter Commission. A candidate to revise the city charter was given November 7 when city electors voted 733 to 116 to revise the charter. Following the election of the Charter Commission, the city's charter will be revised and a third election will be held to determine whether or not the new charter will be accepted by the residents of the city.

### Attendants Foil Station Burglary

A car stuck in a snowbank and a gas station attendant's sharp eyes combined Sunday night to apprehend a burglar at Bud and Carl's station, Eight Mile and Tuck Road.  
Carl Whitlock, one of the partners in the station, received a call for the wrecker near the station, and opened the station to take the wrecker to assist a stuck car. When he returned, he noticed that a window was broken at the rear of the building and the door wasn't closed as he had left it.  
Whitlock called his partner, Bud Colvin, and the State Police. Colvin arrived at the station before the police did, and both men started to examine the premises.  
They could find no one in the station, but Whitlock noticed a strange car standing in the line waiting for service at the station the next morning. When the two men examined the car, they found Frank Massaway, 22, hiding in the rear seat.  
When the State Police arrived, Massaway was taken into custody. He pleaded guilty to a charge of breaking and entering Tuesday morning before Justice of the Peace Randall C. Kohler, and was bound over to Circuit Court for trial.  
Police recovered between \$50 and \$60 worth of merchandise from Massaway's car. The gas station partners identified it as coming from their station, and police impounded it for court evidence.

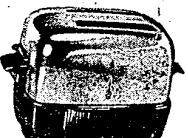
