County Base Ball League

Representatives from ten high

day and organized the Oakland
County High School Baseball
League and elected officers. R. S.

vice president; Martin Verberg,
of Pontiac, secretary, and E. J.
Lederle of Royal Oak, treasurer.

The league is composed of two
divisions of five teams each—the
western division including Mil-
ford, South Lyon, Holly, Clarkston
and Farmington high schools, and
the eastern division the schools at
Birmingham, Royal Oak, Roch-
ester, Oxford and Orion. The teams
of each division will play a series
of games and the winning teams
will contest for the county cham-
pionship at a field meet which will
probably be held Saturday, June 6.
The league has been divided as
ten teams with Saturday as the
main playing days. Play will be-
gin as soon as the weather permits.

troit left about two o'clock.

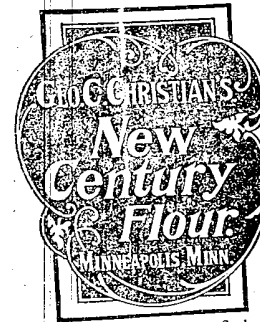
