Farmington - A Key Spot . . .

in the defense of Michigan. Now that our eyes are fully in focus with the New Year — we are faced with a serious problem. It is a problem of defense, and Farmington is a main link in the future protection of

Farmington is a main link in the future protection of the state.

Some may ask why. Farmington is a small town, it has no giant industrial plants or military installations, it can not be considered a critical target area for enemy bombs. These facts may all be true, but — Farmington is located on the main highway linking Lansing with Detroit. It does have a number of smaller industrial plants of vital importance to the defense efforts. It is in immediate proximity to the largest industrial center in the nation.

Farmington has already been designated as an air spotter station in the state-wide system of ground observation posts. The Red Cross has already surveyed the area for emergency housing and feeding of masses. These steps have been initiated by outside organizations with the cooperation of local leaders. It is a step in the right direction, but we must initiate some constructive steps ourselves. These steps must of necessity be coordinated with the program now being organized in the metropolitan area of Detroit.

Should Detroit or other key cities in the concentrated industrial areas of the state come under enemy attack, Farmington will have to handle the heavy flow of transportation using U. S. 16. Thus a volunteer police force should be recruited and trained. This could be a critical problem and an almost fatal one unless we are prepared to handle it. An over-all defense plan in case of such an emergency is of vital

state civilian defense programs.

We all sincerely hope that such a program will not be necessary—but we also hope that, should it be necessary, we will be organized to meet the emergency with efficiency.

It's A New Year . .
