The extension of work to the graveling and grading of Township Roads was approved last Tuesday evening at the regular meeting of the Farmington Township Board.

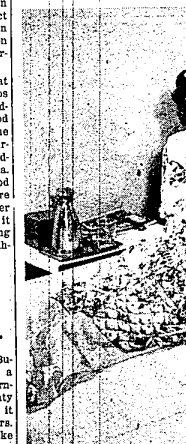

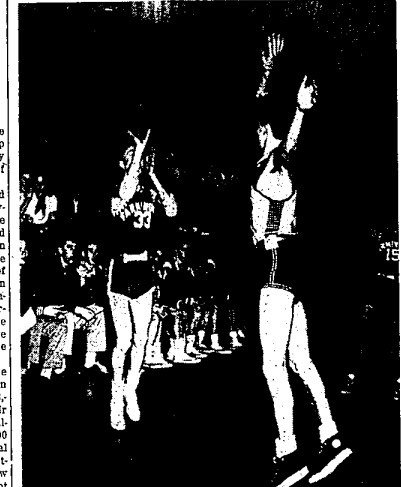
