grabbed off 231 of its workers-for service.

Michigan park visitors last year spent \$347,000 for hot dogs and soda pop at state parks. Wars and troubled futures never hurt the wiener business.

Question from reader: "If the state's fiscal year deficit was \$21 million, why was the average daily deficit only \$100,000?" Answer: The State of Michigan began the past fiscal year (starting July 1, 1949) with a balance of \$24,357,138. The state spent \$44 million more than it received in revenues. The year-end deficit of \$21 million therefore would have been much greater—possibly \$10,745,493—the exact red-ink entry.

Investigate Reports of Early Deer Starvation

Conservation department field men are investigating reports of early deer starvation in the northern lower peninsula.

Department deer specialist, I. H. Bartlett, discounts the starvation angle this early in the season. He says "these deer may be weak fawns which the early severe winter is knocking off. Disease should not be a factor either, since little of it has ever bothered the state's deer herd."

John Byrle, M-10 district game manager, notes that seven deer killed by automobiles on district roads all appear to be in excellent condition.

Dead fawns in the Lake St. Helen vicinity have been reported to department Roscommon headquarters.

Another report was received of a fawn which staggered into a Lovells area lumber camp and died.
