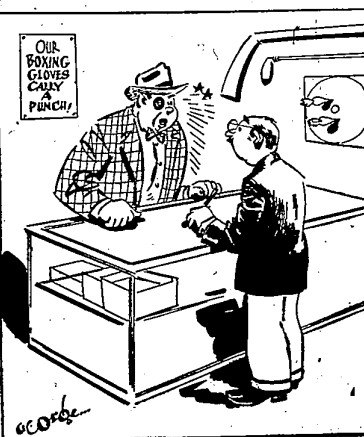

It is hereby RESOLVED by the City of Farmington that all Federal and other Rent Controls within said City of Farmington, be and are hereby terminated as of the date of this Resolution.
