New vaccine cuts spread of Bang's disease 50%

A new Bang's vaccine called Brucella M. is showing outstanding results in tests made by Michigan State College research and extension veterinarians in co-operation with the State Veterinarian. Some 400 herds with more than 5,000 cattle were checked. In herds not vaccinated, indications of the disease accounted for more than 7 per cent. In herds vaccinated with Brucella M., only 3.6 per cent showed indications. Abortion in cattle practically ceased after Brucella M. was used. The vaccine developed at the Michigan Agricultural Experiment Station is available through veterinarians specially licensed by the State Department of Agriculture. dinance by amendment rather than by compiling a new ordinance. The system, which must be completed within two years according to the charter, will present a complete record of any ordinance in one volume.

CHANGE TERMS
Terms of the city council were also slightly altered on the recommendation of John Isgrig, charter consultant for the Michigan Municipal League.

The commission had tentatively set the terms of the city councilmen at four years, with two of the five being elected at one biennial election, and three at the next. The altered system has three councilmen elected at each biennial election, with two for a term of four years and one for only two years. Under this system, a majority change will be possible at each election.

VOTE IN APRIL

If the charter obtains the signature of the governor and the plans for filing are successful, the charter will face a vote for adoption or rejection at the city election this April. However, at the election city officers under the present charter will be elected. At a special election to be held after presumed adoption of the charter, an entire new slate of candidates will face the voters. They will elect the first five councilmen to serve under the new charter. However, election of a judge and associate judge under the municipal court plan will not come until 1955.

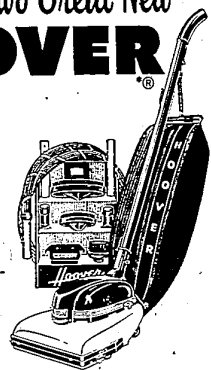
