So if Sen. Harry Byrd's economy ideas prevail in congress, state taxpayers will be saved some \$435,300,000.

A citizen advisory committee has recommended the consolidation of 15 independent, professional and trade licensing boards in one agency. The new department would handle licensing for occupations ranging from accounting to embalmers, chiropractors and plumbers.
