Mile Road intersects Grand River. Loomis added that the letter indicated that it probably would be several months before the blinker light could be erected. The City had requested the erection of a light and direction signs from the highway department some time ago.

The Commission approved the appointment of Col. Sam L. Smith, 32007 Valleyview, to represent the City of Farmington on the Detroit Regional Planning Commission. Mayor Delos Hamlin explained that the Commission has requested the appointment of a representative from the City to serve on a board with representatives of Lyon, Farmington, Commerce and Novi Townships and the cities of South Lyon and Farmington. This group will assist the Planning Commission and also serve as an information group between the Detroit office and the local communities. The commission is developing an overall planning guide for the entire Detroit Metropolitan Area.

They stated that the Civic Association is anxious to have as many registered voters in the area as possible. The Commission agreed to work out the details.

The Commission approved a motion to grant an additional \$600 to the Farmington Township Library to complete the \$1,000 set aside in the 1950-51 budget for the Board.

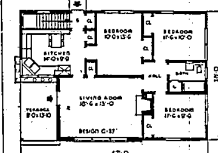
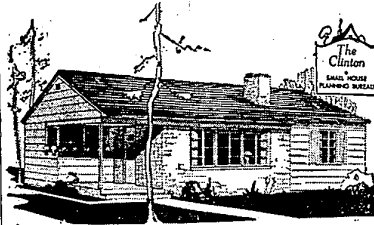
