## BOOK CIRCULATION HITS ALL TIME MARK AT HIGH SCHOOL

Book circulation at Farmington High Library reached 1330 in No-wember, the highest circulation of any month during the last semester and a new four year record accord-ing to figures released by the li-brarian. This figure Jackudes 979 fiction books and 351 non-fiction books


