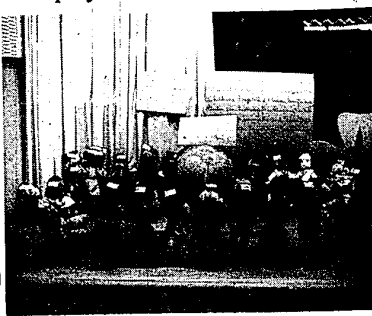

The Grist Mill

Here are a few notes we jotted down from recent meetings regarding soils, crops and dairy, conducted during Farmers Week at Michigan State College.

Feeding Cattle
Dr. Huffman of the Dairy Department says that more and more we are learning that we must feed the bacteria in the rumen of the cow. If we are going to really feed the cow right, he says that this bacteria is what makes the cow tick, and that maybe our whole scheme of feeding dairy cattle is due for a change.

Ladino Clover
M. B. Tesar of the Farm Crops Department says that ladino clover, where properly adapted, is proving very satisfactory as a pasture crop. Further, ladino clover in mixtures with alfalfa and bromegrass, not only raises the nutritive value of pasture and hay crops, but also increases the present acre yield in recent trials. The average yield on the trials of 2.27 ton of ladino-bromegrass-alfalfa mixture and 2.5 ton on alfalfa alone. The ladino-alfalfa bromegrass mixture was 6 to 8 lbs. alfalfa, 2 to 3 lbs. bromegrass and 1 1/2 lb. ladino clover to the acre.

Value of Alfalfa
Carter Harrison of the Crops Department says that alfalfa is still a very important crop. He says that alfalfa acreage is going down, and one item might be the high cost of seed. He emphasized that ladino clover is a short rotation crop and that even though alfalfa might cost twice as much per bushel for seed, it was still the most profitable crop to raise. In talking about fertility and how crops use one item sticks by it, it is not the cost of seed but the loss of the seedling that hurts farmers most. Further, Mr. Harrison stated that now is the time to order alfalfa seed and also take delivery for next spring's seedlings.

Grasses and the Soil
A. E. Erickson of the Soils Department talked on the effects of grasses on the soil. He stated that one-third of the land is in the form of roots and is very valuable as far as humus is concerned. Without humus fertilization, moisture and friability of the soil was lost. In pointing out the value of grasses and green manures in maintaining humus in the soil, he said that plowing down one ton of alfalfa, including the roots, returned 350 lbs. of ammonium nitrate, 150 lbs. of super-phosphate and 100 lbs. of potash. Common sense for getting seedlings are (1) test for lime, (2) fertilize with a high phosphate fertilizer, and (3) shallow plow behind the disks on your drill.

If you have purchased your fertilizer early and are storing it on the farm, Michigan State College soils scientists advise checking the way you have placed the sacks.

Schools Form New Activities League
