#### Winter Diets May Lack Vitamins

How is your children's winter diet, asks Mary Lewis, of the foods and nutrition department of Michl-gan State College's school of home economics.

Compare the diet with a recent check on the wintertime meals of a hundred Michigan school children. In the main, the children were provided with milk and meat. Breads, cereals, cakes and cookies were eaten in abundance. But few children were given at least one serving of a green or yellow vege-

sable.

Searcely any had a fresh fruit or vegetable salad; and almost two-birds had not dependable source of Vitamin C.

Green and yellow vegetables are rich in Yitamin A, cites the foods and nutrition authority. This vitamin aids in maintaining the normal health of the protective membranes lining the nose and throat. They are the body's "front-line defenses" against harmful bacteria.


