PROPOSAL NO. 1
A Joint Resolution of the 1951 Legislature proposing an amendment to Section 13 of Article V of the State Constitution providing for annual regular sessions of the Legislature.

PROPOSAL NO. 2
A Joint Resolution of the 1951 Legislature proposing an amendment to Article X by adding a new section thereto, to stand as Section 25, providing for a bonus of \$500.00 to survivors of persons in military service who have died or shall hereafter die from service connected causes, between June 27, 1950, and the termination of the state of national emergency.

PROPOSAL NO. 3
A Joint Resolution of the 1951 Legislature proposing an amendment to Section 3 of Article XVI of the State Constitution, permitting an increase of salaries of Supreme Court Justices after election or appointment, so that all Justices serving concurrently may receive the same salaries.

THE SUNSHINE LADY: Cub Scouts Study Hawaii During March "Scouting Round The World"

What interesting news did you get in the mail this morning? Was it a note from an old friend or did you make yourself a new friend? Because I have been finding myself with a few extra hours each week, I decided to do something with them. I took on a group of seven Cub Scouts, all around eight years old. They have been keeping me so busy I already feel years younger. As perhaps a great many of you know, in Cub Scouting the theme for March was "Scouting Around The World". My group chose Hawaii.

We learned that Mr. Stephen Derby at the Bank of Hawaii, Honolulu, headed the group in that area and enjoys hearing from folks in Michigan. Mr. Louis Rogers of Honolulu also came to our aid and did a Mrs. E. W. Warren of the Hawaii Visitors Bureau. Then Mr. M. Matsura of the Koa House sent us several hand carved novelties, which included coconut buttons, a watch bob made from coconut with a tapa strap, a lauhala napkin ring, and a koa wood duck. The tapa cloth is made of the beaten bark of the paper mulberry tree. Strength is given to the tapa by many layers of bark laid both lengthwise and crosswise and pounded together with a beater, and sometimes pasted together with a starchy root called pia. It is used by the natives for clothing, bed covering, and serves as swaddling clothes for infants and shrouds for the dead.

We learned so much about tapa.

2. The absence of a top-flight labor man in Charlie Wilson's staff. When Stuart Symington ran for labor mobilization, he appointed a labor advisory council, but not Wilson.

3. Truman's crack comparing railroad workers to Russians. This convinced labor chieftains that the President was against them for keeps.

Now it's mutual.

HEROIC 2nd DIVISION
One of the best things about the new and victorious advance in Korea is the way the gallant 2nd division has staged a comeback. Last November, in the tragic retreat from Korea, the 2nd division took the heaviest punishment of all. It was given the tough assignment of holding off the enemy while the rest of the 8th army pulled back below the 38th parallel.

This resulted in some bitter, bloody punishment, with casualties so heavy that General MacArthur called Washington that the 2nd division was "unfit for further combat."

However, the 2nd division has now staged one of the most magnificent comebacks of the Korean war. Under Lieut. Gen. Matt Ridgway, it went back into the line along the Taebak mountains in the bitterly contested Wonju area and heroically stopped a North Korean end run around the U. N. right flank.

Then the 2nd division reversed the tables, pulled back 12 miles, drew the North Koreans into a trap, bit the trapped Communists on their flank and wiped them out. It was a brilliant maneuver that, proving that this division, with an outstanding record in two previous wars, is now carrying on its tradition as proudly as ever.

WASHINGTON PIPELINE
Senator Taft refused to allow one of his speeches to be broadcast over the mutual broadcasting system because it was the most deleted criticism of Taft from the script of mutual commentator Frank Edwards, who is sponsored by the A. F. of L.

Thus Taft, who has been critical of labor, was in the position of denying a labor-sponsored commentator the right to criticize him. Taft's terms were delivered to the network by administrative assistant, Jack Martin. Later, network officials examined Edwards' script, found it wasn't as critical as Taft had thought. GOP colleagues are needing Rep. Clarence Brown of Ohio, long considered the leader of Ohio congressmen, about the activities of ebullient George Bender. Bender, they say, is stealing Brown's spotlight.

First Picnickers Visit State Parks

While first picnickers already have invaded three state parks, the conservation department reports Wells park near Menominee has more snow on the ground than at any time during the winter.

Hot dogs were crackling in their juices over outdoor grills at Warren Dunes park near St. Joseph. More sumptuous outdoor "grands" opened the picnicking season at Dodge No. 4 and Bald Mountain parks near Pontiac.

Spongy roads in a number of park and recreation areas temporarily have been closed to traffic, according to the department's parks division. Black-topped stretches have been buckling because of alternate freezing and thawing.

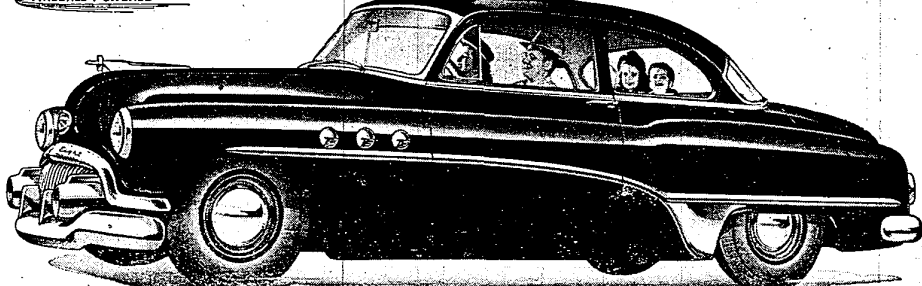
