Prices will bump the parity celling for all storable commodities grown in Michigan. The seasonal price decrease at harvest time is expected to be less than normal.

Large government holdings of dry edible beans have tended to hold prices down. But excessive stocks of Michigan beans of mark etable quality are expected to disappear by 1951 crop harvest time The crop support price will be 75 per cent of parity, but a price near-er 90 per cent of parity is expected in Michigan.

No support for potatoes is indicated, and acreage should be reduced. A 15 per cent cut has been
requested in the U. S., 13 per cent




