### Report On Eye Survey Progress

Mrs. John C. Baggett of the Clarenceville Parent Teachers Association's Health Committee reported this week on the progress of the Clarenceville eye survey. Her report states:

"The Clarenceville P.T.A. has always had as its goal the best possible health for every child. For this reason they have supplied the school system with an eye survey which has been in progress for almost two years.

This has been made possible at no cost to either the children's parents or the Board of Education, because of the donated time of the working group.

Dr. E. Gaymes and Dr. M. Honeyman have donated approximately 50 half days. The clerical help has been provided by the various P.T.A. members and other community ladies, who gave generously of their time.

There have been found 600 children who need no eye attention at this date. There are another 500 children who need eye attention ranging from glasses to eye surgery.

Because the P.T.A.'s main interest is the health and welfare of all its children, it would like to point out that early care helps and corrects defects that may take on a very serious character later in life.

This project will continue for five years. The Clarenceville P.T.A. requests more volunteers for this project.

If your child has no eye defect, be thankful and help. If an eye defect has been pointed out to you on the survey sheet be grateful and help.

The eye survey is held every Wednesday morning at the different schools from 9 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. Visitors are welcome."



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### Home "Dem" Work Proves Good Career

If you want a well-paying job which gives a lot of personal satisfaction through the public service you perform, don't overlook a career in home demonstration work.

That's the advice of Mrs. Leona MacLeod, head of the Michigan State College home economics extension service. Mrs. MacLeod adds that although salaries are high for home demonstration agents, the demand, too, is always large.

Home demonstration agents are employees of the land-grant colleges but their headquarters are in the county buildings of the various counties of the state. As a part of the educational system of the state, they have done probably as much as any other group to show the people of the state better ways to good home and family living. In Michigan the salary schedule for home demonstration work is \$3,200 to \$5,500 a year with a

month's vacation. After experience, the home demonstration agent may become an extension specialist in

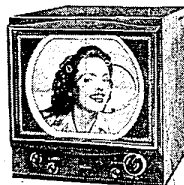
some area of home economics, or she may work into a supervisory position.

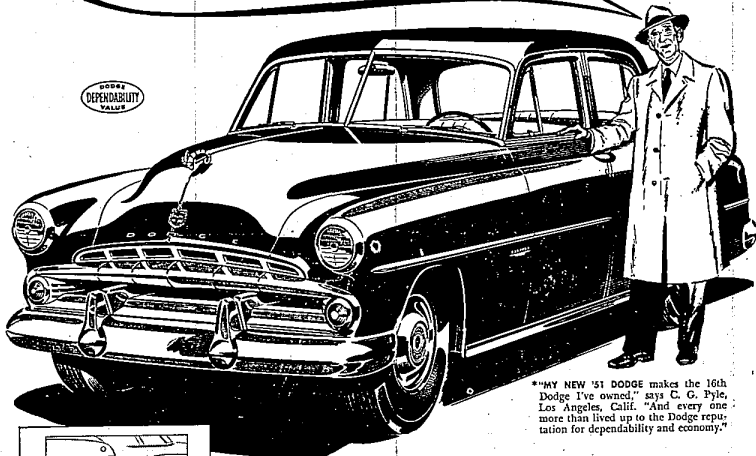
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
