who now bosses Yugoslavia is extremely frank about the danger of an attack on his country this spring.

Tito also expressed the view that, if the Russians attack, they will drive through the British zone of Austria, skirt one side of Trieste, and advance down the unguarded Adriatic coast. The Yugoslavs will off all Adriatic seaports and make it impossible for the United States to send military aid to him.

Simultaneously, Tito predicted the Bulgarian army would advance from the opposite direction to cut off the rail line from Yugoslavia to Salonika (Greece). He added that, in anticipation of such an attack, he had established a series of hidden fortifications along the Balkan mountain coast—forts that are well stocked with food and ammunition and could hold out for some time.

"I am not worried about an attack by surface armies," Tito said. "The Hungarians, Poles and Czechs will not fight. The Bulgarians will fight better because they have been promised Macedonia. However," he added, "if the Red Army itself attacks, that is another story."

Tito also expressed the opinion that Moscow did not want the Korean war to spread and actually had tried to hold back the Chinese from taking the offensive against the U.N. forces there. He based this view on his own experiences with the Kremlin; also because the Russians are well aware that Yugoslavia, Poland and other states in the region are not suitable persons.
