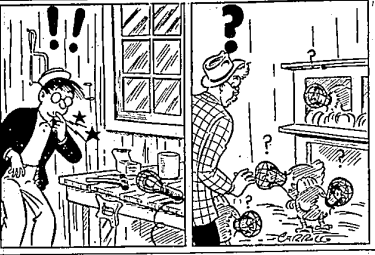

who now bosses Yugoslavia is extremely frank about the danger of an attack on his country this spring.

Tito also expressed the view that, if the Russians attack, they will drive through the British zone of Austria, shift one side of Trieste, and advance down the unguarded Dalmatian coast. This would cut off all Adriatic seaports and make it impossible for the United States to send military aid to him.

Simultaneously, Tito predicted, the Bulgarian army would advance from the opposite direction to cut off the rail line from Yugoslavia to Salonika (Greece). He added that, in anticipation of such an attack, he had established a series of hidden forts in the hills along the Dalmatian coast—forts that are well stocked with food and ammunition and could hold out for some time.

"I am not worried about an attack by satellite armies," Tito said. "The Hungarians, Poles and Czechs will not fight. The Bulgarians will fight better because they have been promised Macedonia. However," he added, "if the Red army itself attacks, that is something else again."

Tito also expressed the opinion that Moscow did not want the Korean war to spread and actually had tried to hold back the Chinese from taking the offensive against the U.S. forces there. He based this view on his own experiences with the Kremlin; also because the Russians had sent Yugoslav, Polish and other satellite nations to work in China in an attempt to cement the Soviet orbit through an exchange of personnel. Some of these Yugoslavs, he said, had reported that the Chinese were working to bring the Russo-Chinese relations back to him.

Vigorous in his denunciation of Russia, Tito said, "We do not propose to become an appendage of Russia." Then, to his American friend he added, with a smile, "nor of America, either."

### WELL-TRAINED TROOPS

Perhaps the most important fact about present American aid to Yugoslavia is that, in effect, we are buying the support of 32 Yugoslav divisions. This brings up the all-important question: are they prepared and will they last longer than the Yugoslav army in 1941?

### 16 More Forest Fires Ravage 239 Acres

Lingering blasts of winter notwithstanding, the conservation department reports 16 more forest fires ravished 239 primarily southern Michigan acres.

First fires were recorded this season in the northern lower peninsula. Six fires were put out in the Haldim and Gladwin districts. Nine fires burned over 212 acres in the 11-county Plainfield district.

Provided, however, that I can receive no names for registration during the time intervening between the twelfth day before any regular, special or official primary election, and the day of such election.
