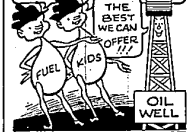
Two Seniors Get Scholarships

Trojans Fourth In Ypsi Meet

The Clarencville Trojans placed fourth in the league track meet held at Ypsilanti Wednesday, May 9. Clarencville placed behind Clarkston, Holly and Milford. Clarkston placed first with 42 1/10 points and Clarencville received 37 3/10 points. Northville rounded out the league with 44 points. Ed Chappel placed first in the mile in five minutes, 10 seconds and 1/10. In the shot-put to take four points for the Trojans, the medley relay team consisting of Garlin Davis, Albert and Walter also came in second place. Each gained one point.

The Trojans captured third place in six different events, with Ray Jacobson in the broad jump and Joe Whyte in the 100 yard dash and the low hurdles. Bill Kyola took third place in the 440 and Al Cook secured the same spot in the 220.

The Trojans captured one fourth place and tied once for the same spot. Allen Schweizer took fourth in the 880 and Stanley Kroll tied with a Milford man for fourth place. Bob Garbin took fifth place in the shot-put to round up the scoring for the Trojans.
