



Slated For July 9

Leading Michigan state and local government officials, educators and state administrators will meet July 9-12 at Michigan State College for the sixth annual Forum on State and Local Government.

Panels by top government officials headed by Governor G. Mennen Williams, will be held each morning, followed by student discussion and field trips in the afternoon.

Police Crack Down
On Unsafe Autos

"There may be some dispute as to the origin of the word 'fatboy' but as far as the vehicles themselves are concerned, their end is near."

Chief Joseph G. DeVriendt issued that statement last week as a warning to drivers and owners of unsafe cars. Farmington's police have been instructed to issue tickets on all cars that do not measure up to maximum safety standards.

Cars with only one headlight, or with burned out or obscured rear lights, will be one of the principal targets in the campaign. Drivers who operate cars with bad brakes or other obviously dangerous conditions also will find themselves in trouble, the chief said.

The strict enforcement policy going into effect is in support of Farmington's safety program, which is being sponsored by the State Safety Commission in cooperation with the National Safety Council.

"A person who knowingly drives an unsafe car hardly qualifies as a responsible driver," Chief DeVriendt emphasized. "Nor does an unsafe vehicle give him the confidence he needs to cope with current driving conditions. It's a simple case of both the driver and his car becoming extra hazards to safety, and we're going to do our best to eliminate those hazards."
