Mrs. R. G. Kahl, Mrs. F. E. Lag, son and Mrs. Ray Welderoader at a plastic display on Thursday afternoon.

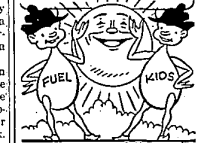
