PROMPT CARE CAN STOP BLINDNESS U-M DOCTOR SAYS

Many cases of blindness can be prevented by prompt diagnosis coupled with proper and adequate treatment, according to a University of Michigan eye specialist.

"It is wrong to think one's vision merely goes bad as the result of advancing age," Dr. Harold F. Falls, associate professor in the University Medical School's Department of Ophthalmology, declared.

He estimated that there are upwards of one million people in the United States affected with blindness. Many of these cases are due to preventable causes.

"Prevention of blindness in the adult individual is largely a problem of education," the U-M doctor said. "Loss of any visual acuity warrants a careful eye examination to expose the cause."

People should recognize that vision difficulties are often associated with constitutional disease and should seek prompt medical attention when eye symptoms present themselves, Dr. Falls explained.

The belief that people in their forties and fifties have to spare their eyes is false, he pointed out. "Healthy eyes need not be spared and close work does eyes no harm (if adequate lighting and corrected glasses are provided), he added.


Five outstanding causes of blindness were listed by Dr. Falls as: 1) glaucoma, a hardening of the eye-ball causing pressure on the optic nerve and the delicate nervous elements of the retina; 2) industrial or household injury; 3) pterygium, a wing-like growth of new formed tissue occurring over the cornea; 4) cataract, a disease of the eye lens; and 5) detachment of the retina, the nervous membrane of sight.

Enlarge Outdoor Areas By 2,741 Acre Addition

State game, fish, recreation and forest areas are being enlarged through purchase of 2,741 acres at a cost of \$60,510, the conservation department reports.

Purchase funds are from state fishing and hunting license and federal Pittman - Robertson revenue.

Nearly 1,000 acres are being added to the recently started Rouge River Valley wildlife area in Kent County. About 250 acres are being added to the Tuscola, Murphy Lake, Deford and Vassar state game areas in Tuscola County.

Latest additions to other established game areas and wildlife projects are: 200 acres, Middleville, Barry County; 160 acres, Gregory, Livingston County; 50 acres, Maple River, Clinton and Gratiot Counties; 50 acres, Pittsford, Hillsdale County; 33 acres, Flat River, Ionia and Montcalm Counties; and 40 acres, Martiny Lake, Mecosta County.

The Holly recreation area, Oakland County, will be larger by 370 acres, the Ortonville area in Oakland and Lapeer Counties by 112 acres. State forest additions: 120 acres, Houghton Lake, 240 acres; Lake Superior, 80 acres; and Sturgeon River, 80 acres. Forty acres of public fishing access, 1,750 feet frontage, are being purchased on Lake County's Switzer Lake.
