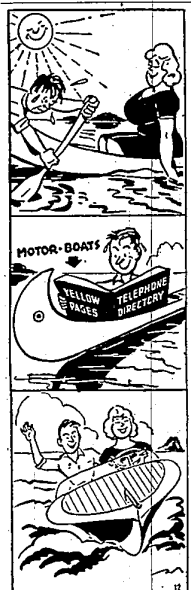

### 3 PLANETS IN ROW TO MARK JULY SKY, ASTRONOMER SAYS

Not one, not two, but three planets in a row! That is the prospect for late July in the southwestern sky after sunset, Dr. Hazel M. Losh, assistant professor of astronomy at the University of Michigan, reports.

Dominating the trio of planets will be the brilliant Venus which will be at its brightest on July 23. No one can mistake this planet which has the right spot in the west during the early evening hours for weeks.

Here's how the other two planets will get "into the act." Dr. Losh reports, Mercury, which was in evidence in April, will be to the right of Venus and to the left will be Saturn. The three will be almost in a straight line.

"Two bright stars will add further color to the southwestern sky," Dr. Losh adds. The bright Regulus will be to the right of Mercury while Spica will be just beyond

"Mercury's position for observation will not be as good as it was in April but it should be easily identified in relation to Venus."

The bright astronomer points out, "It will reach its best position on August 3-7."

As Venus disappears in the west, another bright planet will be rising in the east and will soon claim the attention now given to Venus, Dr. Losh points out. Early in July Jupiter will be rising almost exactly in the east by midnight. By the end of the month, it will be visible by 10 p.m.

July also brings with it an excellent chance to look at the Milky Way, that great concourse of stars, star clusters, bright nebulae, star clouds and dark dust clouds that has been observed by man through the ages.

"The Milky Way may be easily traced during summer evenings," she says. "Starting in the northeast, it may be followed across the sky through the zenith or mid-point in the sky and on through its two branches."

One branch passes through Scorpius, one of the most beautiful of all the constellations, according to Dr. Losh. The other branch goes through the constellation Sagittarius.

Scorpius is visible directly in the south and consists of a line of bright stars curved like a giant fishhook. One of the stars in this constellation appears very bright and has a fiery red hue. It is Antares, which is believed to be one of the largest known stars. Antares is 400 times the diameter of the sun, has 1,600 times the brightness of the sun, but is so distant that its light takes 250 years to reach the earth.

Sagittarius, the Archer, is low down in the southeastern sky, and represents an archer with bow outstretched and aiming a shaft at the heart of the Scorpion. The eastern half of Sagittarius is better known as "The Little Dipper," since the stars outline a dipper but one that is upside down.

Travelers in Michigan have a choice of 75 camp sites, equipped with tables, benches, stoves and other facilities, in state forests in addition to camping spots in state parks and recreation areas.

### Pacific College 'Adopted' By MSC

Michigan State College has accepted an invitation to "adopt" the University of the Ryukyus in its own educational version of the Point Four program of aid to underdeveloped areas of the world.

The project is designed to transplant the philosophy and programs of America's land-grant college system of education to the newly-formed Pacific university, located near Naha, Okinawa, in the Ryukyus Islands.

The unique undertaking was announced last week by President John A. Hannah of MSC and Dr. Arthur S. Adams, president of the American Council on Education. The project is being sponsored by the U. S. Department of the Army, with the ACE as a cooperating agency.

Michigan State College was selected for the special assignment because of its strong offerings in agriculture, home economics, education and public administration. In addition to the college's outstanding work in adult education and agricultural extension, President Hannah said.

Director of the program will be Dr. Milton E. Nuelder, head of the MSC department of political science and public administration. Heading up the island mission will be Russell Hodgwood, director of MSC's agricultural extension and research programs in the Upper Peninsula. In addition to administrative duties, he also will direct the agricultural and forestry phases of the Ryukyus program.

Other MSC faculty members assigned to the University of Ryukyus are Prof. Guy Fox, who has extensive World War II military government experience in the Far
