Mrs. Carson Baldwin, Farmington Road, returned home from the hospital much improved.

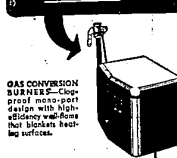
The Arthur Mairs, Shady Side Avenue, were busy tendering an 11th birthday celebration to their son Jimmy on July 14.

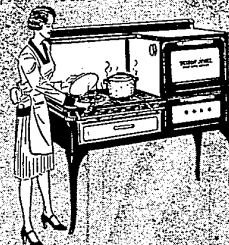
