## Robert Denbo Aboard Destroyer In Japan

Robert D. Denbo, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Denbo of 24104 Independence, has been assigned to the Communications Department of the U.S.S. Wedderburn, a destroyer operating out of Yokosuka, Japan.

Before being recalled to active duty on November 29, 1950, Denbo worked for the Atlantic and Pacific Tea Company in Detroit. He attended Farmington High School until 1945, when he was drafted into the Navy. After being in the South Pacific and participating in the atomic bomb tests at Bikini, he was discharged in December of 1947.

## Dr. Justin Leonard Head Of Wildlife Research

Dr. Justin W. Leonard will assume the new post of research administrator or head of all state wildlife research work beginning August 6, the conservation department announces.

With the department for nearly 17 years, Leonard presently is finishing a master's research project. The entomologist is on the staff of the department's Institute for Fisheries research at Ann Arbor.

He obtained his doctorate in zoology at the University of Michigan in 1937. A native of Iowa, Leonard was in charge of the department's Hunt Creek Fisheries Experiment station at Lewiston from 1939 to 1942.

## ADD TWO NEW COURSES TO ROTC TRAINING AT MICHIGAN STATE COLLEGE

Two new options in flight operations and general technical work have been approved for the U. S. Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps unit at Michigan State College.

The new course offerings are expected to increase air force unit enrollment at MSC from 1,000 to 1,400 next fall, according to Lt. Col. George O. Commemorial, air force commandant.

Starting in 1953, the air force unit will graduate 290 second lieutenants annually as compared with this year's class of 88, Colonel Commemorial said.

Enrollment in the college's total ROTC program, which also includes seven major branches of the U. S. Army, is not expected to change from the 3,200 figure recorded last year, college officials added. All freshmen and sophomores in the ROTC program and those students accepted for advanced training as juniors and seniors are

draft exempt. The new flight operations option is a comprehensive pre-flight program to prepare students for US-AF flying schools. Students will study principles of flight, aircraft engineering, navigation, radar and bombing. They must qualify physically for flying duty, and agree to enter flight training upon graduation.

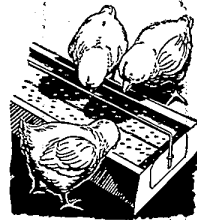

## Feeding with antibiotics speeds growth of baby chicks

Aureomycin, a recent antibiotic development, promotes rapid growth in baby chicks, say poultry researchers at Michigan State College Agricultural Experiment Station. Believing that this drug acts on bacteria in the intestine of the baby chick, they fed Aureomycin to one group of chicks, then inoculated another group. They found that while Aureomycin injections had no beneficial effect on growth, including the drug in normal feeding practices substantially improved growth. More recent experiments have added Penicillin, Terramycin and Bacitracin to the list of antibiotics stimulating growth.
