Feeding with antibiotics speeds growth of baby chicks

Aureomycin, a recent antibiotic development, promotes rapid growth in baby chicks, say poultry researchers at Michigan State College Agricultural Experiment Station. Believing that this drug acts on bacteria in the intestine of the baby chick, they fed Aureomycin to one group of chicks, then innoculated another group. They found that while Aureomycin injections had no beneficial effect on growth, including the drug in normal feeding practices substantially improved growth. More recent experiments have added Penicillin, Terramycin and Bactirach to the list of antiblotic stimulating growth.
