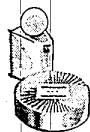

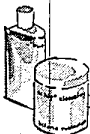

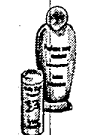

New Saint Martin's Episcopal Church Has Formal Opening Sunday

This Sunday, August 5, will mark the realization of a long dream for members of St. Martin's Episcopal Church. At 11 a.m. formal opening of their new church edifice at Salem and Grand River Avenues will take place.

The first service will be Holy Communion at 8 a.m. and will be taken by the vicar, Rev. James H. Morris. The formal opening at 11 a.m. will see the Rt. Rev. Richard S. Eulich, Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan, officiating.

At the opening ceremonies, the warden of the church, Mr. J. H. Richard, will open the door after

the Bishop knocks three times and says: "Open me the gates of righteousness, that I may go into them, and give thanks unto the Lord."

The parish of St. Martin's was founded in 1925 with first services held in the Pickard Hardware Store on Grand River. Later a schoolhouse was purchased, and this has been in use at Lenore and Curtis Avenues until the present. Until 1948, St. Martin's was served from other parishes, but with the continuing development of northwest Detroit and the Farmington area, the Rev. James H. Morris was appointed to the parish.

The Rev. J. H. Morris was born in Croydon, England, although he grew up and attended public and high school in Manchester, going to Canada as a young man, he studied for the ministry at Wycliffe College at the University of Toronto, graduating with honors in 1940. He is also a graduate in liberal

arts of the University of Western Ontario, London. In the summer of 1948 he came to Detroit to serve the parish of St. Martin's and to do part-time work at St. Paul's Memorial Church.

However, the work at St. Martin's grew so rapidly that in the following November Rev. Morris was relieved of all other duties and became the first full-time vicar of the parish.

Under his leadership the new church has been planned and built in three years. In November of last year, Rev. Morris was elected Dean of the Detroit West Side Convocation.

As soon as it is practicable it is planned to add a wing to the new building, in which will be provided office space and classrooms. For the present the office will be in the basement. If with the passing

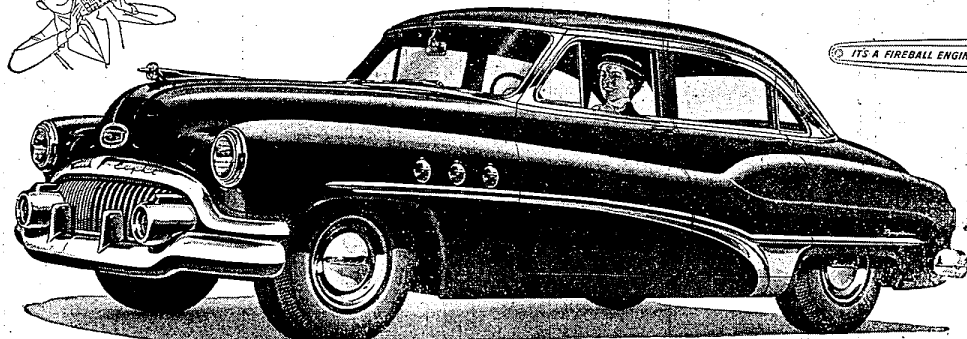
