Broiler Provides Quick Meat Dishes

Main dishes to pop right out of your broiler and onto the dinner table are the pride of homemakers on a warm summer day. With this in mind, Reba Stagg, home economist, makes several "broiler" suggestions.

Meats that are quickly broiled, and, likewise, present thrifty servings include ground beef or lamb patties, Canadian-style bacon, bacon, liver sausage and corned beef hash from the canned meat shelf. In broiling these meats, the same as steaks and chops, make sure that you use a moderate cooking temperature. If meat is cut 1 inch thick, place it on the broiler rack so that it is 2 inches from the heat. If cut thicker, place it farther from the heat.

When you turn the meat on the second side, add the vegetables to the broiler. Seasoning is simple, color the meat with salt and pepper, or tomato halves or pre-cooked potatoes, carrots or cauliflower. Potato cakes are another choice. Cooked whole kernel corn or baked beans are especially grand with broiled meats. Fruits must not be forgotten. Peach or pear halves or pineapple rings add colorful additions. Remember, however, to brush vegetables and fruits with melted butter or margarine before broiling.

STORE CAREFULLY TO PROTECT FOODS AGAINST SPOILAGE

Good storage space for canned foods is cool, dark and dry, according to Roberta Hershey, extension foods and nutrition specialist at Michigan State College.

The place where you store jars of fruit and vegetables also should be well ventilated and insulated if necessary to keep the storage space cool in hot weather and protect against freezing in cold weather.

Whether you decide to use a cabinet or storage room will depend on the amount and kind of food you have to store, but the amount of space available. But you need to protect your investment of work and material from being ruined by spoilage.

Locating your food storage space near the canning center will save time and work in carrying, the MSC specialist said.

If you are planning to make or buy a cabinet remember that an inside depth of 12 inches is best and two rows of jars can be placed on each shelf. A cabinet with inside depth of 6 inches will take care of only one row of fruit jars.

Storage rooms usually are best for use in the basement. You should allow at least 2 square feet of floor space so you can have room to enter and set cans on the shelves or remove them.

In short, allow 1 foot of 12 inch space for each five cans of any size. Or allow 20 feet of shelf space for 100 cans. Top shelves should not be more than 72 inches from the floor.

If the shelves are more than 3' or 4 feet long, they should be supported at 32-inch intervals. Put canned meats on the lower shelves, vegetables next, and fruits near the top, the home economist advised.

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Camp Foods Need Quick Preparation

There's a call to the great outdoors these days, and often that means a camping trip. With that, mother must have minutes to get the food supplies handy - sufficient for the mounting appetites that open air life encourages.

For breakfast "chow" time, Mom knows that the menu should include such hearty and good eating foods as bacon and eggs and fried potatoes. They call for little equipment other than the frying-pan and spatula. She can have some fruit and a pot for coffee along to complete the camping breakfast.

Supper around the wood fire is an event the youngsters will remember. Says Reba Stagg, home economist, Mom can make it an easy menu for her by taking along several cans of luncheon meat. She can cut the canned loaf into half inch slices and heat them in the frying pan.

Roasting ears still in their husks are perfect cooked right in the coals of the fire. There can always be a can of easy to carry, potato chips. If there's a way to chill, watermelon edges eaten fork-free can be the dessert. If not, carefully wrapped chocolate fudge cup cakes can be the dessert to go with plenty of the season's fruits.

PRESSURE SAUCEPAN REQUIRES MORE TIME
Pressure saucepan processing times for non-acid vegetables like corn, peas, beans and greens are 20 minutes longer than those used when foods are processed in a large canner. This is because pressure comes up and goes down so much more rapidly in the smaller pressure pan, MSC extension specialists say.

Big Farm Events In U.P. During August

Farmers and others in southern Michigan who may be taking a summer vacation trip to the Upper Peninsula of the state will find that the region's two big agricultural events take place during August. Visits to the events will be of special interest to rural families.

"Farmer's Round-Up", a day-long open house at the Chatham station of the Michigan Agricultural Experiment Station, is set for Friday, August 3. Research, designed to improve agriculture in northern Michigan, will be on display.

Station staff, county agricultural agents and Michigan State College officials will be on hand to discuss the research being conducted for the benefit of the Upper Peninsula.

Tuesday, August 14, will be the opening day of the Upper Peninsula State Fair at Escanaba. As in past years, the U. P. State Fair will emphasize the 4-H Club program.

MSC Establishes New Hotel Course

A new post-graduate course, designed to bridge the college-to-business gap for future employees of the nation's hotel and restaurant industries, will be launched at Michigan State College this summer.

The course, believed the first of its type in the nation, will run for a full year on a non-degree basis. Prof. Donald Greenaway, head of the department of restaurant management at MSC, will direct the program.

Laboratory for the trainees, who must be graduates of an accredited hotel or restaurant management school, will be the Kellogg Hotel on the campus of Michigan State College.

Approximately 15 to 20 students are expected for the first year's course, with an eventual capacity of about 40 each year.

Early tree of youngsters entering kindergarten in the fall. Clarenceville will receive aid for three more years under the act. Next year the District will receive approximately 75% of the original payment, the third year they will receive approximately 50% and the fourth year they will receive approximately 25%. The law will not be in effect past the fourth year.

The Board has granted a \$100 bonus to all regular employees who have been in steady employment from September 1950 to June 1951. Action was taken by the Board on June 9 stipulating that the bonus would be paid if the aid was received. The Board also approved the granting of an additional \$50 bonus to teachers who had not used any of their sick leave during the year 1950 - 51. Those teachers who will use one day of sick leave will receive \$40, those using two days, \$30, those using three days \$20, and those using 4 days \$10.
