shows manufacturers like proximity to manufacturers' market, availability of skilled labor, nearness to materials and general characteristics of state as place to live.

They dislike high wage levels, low productivity — especially in Detroit — distance from markets and distance from steel sources.

No more enrollment padding has been found in Michigan schools. Twelve districts have been audited, 288 yet to go.

Michigan now ranks fifth in total motor truck registrations with 266,300 listed. California leads with 571,462.

Business apparently is good in the state. Rec. Motors of Lansing reports that it sold \$11,865,000 worth of lawn mowers in 1950-51. At the same time General Motors announces a \$1 per share dividend on common stock and Oldsmobile says it will build a half-million cars a year by 1950.

New and used car dealers expect an upsurge in sales, but they are not sure whether it will result from easier credit terms or fears of a price increase.

The Michigan Health Council is producing a movie on how to go about organizing a community health council. Most of the action is being filmed in Michigan towns.

Agricultural economists at Michigan State College predict a substantial increase in egg prices in the next few months. They also see a continued strong demand for pork, a record U. S. corn crop and a plentiful supply of peaches.

Last year five health department mobile x-ray units, working at 21 county fairs, took 55,558 x-rays, of which 1,087 revealed chest abnormalities and 518 indicated tuberculosis.
