Tragedy struck our neighborhood last week end. A fishing boat explosion near Caseville, Michigan, took the life of our neighbor George Johnson of Belfast Street. Father of seven year old Larry and nine year old Sandra Johnson, he was only 30 years old and a very well-known man in our vicinity only a year, the Johnsons name is well known, and the hearts of many are torn by this sadness. He was the only child of Mr. and Mrs. Ronald Johnson of Redford.

The Johnsons had stayed for a third week at Caseville vacationing. Their daughter Candy was with her grandparents in Redford and son Larry had returned home from Caseville a few days before the accident with their Middlebelt Road neighbors, Mr. and Mrs. Vernon Hawley, who had been vacationing with them. Friday morning, Mrs. Johnson was ready to return home after a wonderful vacation, but Mr. Johnson urged that they go out fishing "just once more."

Trouble with the motor caused Mr. Johnson, an engineer, to be called to that end of the boat just as the explosion occurred. Mr. Johnson's death a day later was the result of lung injuries from the flames. Had he lived, doctors reported that he would have been crippled, for he was badly burned. Several other persons were seriously injured.

Another neighbor's death was that of Archie R. Wright, who left all with his wife for the past several years at the home of their son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Watwood of 2218 Middle-


