Board To Discuss Building Plans

Preliminary plans on the proposed construction of elementary classrooms in the Clarenceville School District will be the main topic of discussion at the regular meeting of the Board of Education Monday evening.

The school architect has been directed to have preliminary sketches of a new elementary school as well as possible additions ready for the Monday evening meeting. Plans are also expected to be discussed regarding a special election to be held sometime this fall. The election would include a millage increase as well as authorization for a bond issue.

Eberle Smith, Associates, school architects, have been working on tentative sketches for the past week. Louis Schmidt, superintendent, explained that these are only brief sketches and not complete plans or specifications. These details will have to be worked out as the program progresses. He added that the Board is endeavoring to compile all of the necessary information on the proposal so that it can be presented to the voters in ample time to allow them to study and discuss it prior to an election.

The Board has already approved a resolution of intention to seek permission to expand the elementary school facilities. At the present time, first, third and fourth grades of the Clarenceville School District are on half day sessions. This has resulted from a shortage of grade school classrooms.

The right to reject any or all bids. Sealed bids on the construction work for the new elementary school on 10 Mile Road, the Bond School addition and Middlebelt School addition, will be opened by the Board on September 17. WE GOTTA HURRY . . .


