Township School District of Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, will receive sealed bids for the construction and completion of addition and alterations to Isaac Bond School, addition to Middlebelt and Ten Mile Road School, and new Ten Mile Road Elementary School, Farmington, Michigan, until 5:00 p.m., S. P. Monday, September 17, 1951, at the office of the Board of Education, 33000 Thomas, Farmington, Michigan, at which time and place all bids will be opened and publicly read aloud.

Bidders may bid upon any one or more of the base proposals. No other combination of base proposals will be considered.

Base Bid A—Architectural trades of the entire project covering all work listed under Base Bids B, C and D.

Base Bid B—Architectural trades for addition and alterations to Isaac Bond School.

Base Bid C—Architectural trades for addition to Middlebelt and Ten Mile Road School.

Base Bid D—Architectural trades for new Ten Mile Road Elementary School.

Base Bid A—Mechanical work of the entire project covering all work listed under Base Bids B, C and D.

Base Bid B—Mechanical work for addition and alterations to Isaac Bond School.

Base Bid C—Mechanical work for addition to Middlebelt and Ten Mile Road School.

Bidders will be required to furnish satisfactory performance bond in the amount of 100% of the contract and satisfactory labor and material bond in the amount of 100% of the contract. The accepted bidder shall pay total cost of these bonds.

Plans and specifications may be obtained on and after Wednesday, August 29, 1951, at the office of the architect, Elmer M. Smith Associates, Inc., 155 East Elizabeth Street, Detroit 1, Michigan.

Proposals must be submitted on forms furnished by the architect and supplemented by a certified check or bid bond submitted in accordance with the schedule included in the specifications.

All proposals submitted shall remain firm for a period of thirty days after official opening of bids.

Plans for work covered in each of the base proposals are bound separately. One set of architectural specifications covers the work of all base proposals under the architectural trades, one set of mechanical specifications covers all work of the base proposals of the electrical trades, and one set of kitchen equipment specifications covers all work of the base proposals under kitchen equipment.

A check in the amount of \$10.00 must be submitted as a deposit for each set of plans taken out. A check in the amount of \$10.00 must be submitted as a deposit for each set of specifications taken out. All checks are to be refunded when plans and/or specifications are returned, provided that a rental of \$2.00 per day will be charged contractor for each set of plans and specifications retained longer than agreed upon.

The Board of Education reserves the right to reject any or all bids in whole or in part, and to waive any informalities therein.

The New Orleans petition was circulated after both President Truman and this commentator had published the shocking 111-1 refusal in Wisconsin. Nevertheless its results showed how many of the American people either have forgotten the inspiring precepts of the founding fathers or else become afraid of the expression of liberal ideas.

Here are some of the reactions received by reporter Allen Johnson when he circulated the New Orleans copy of the Declaration of Independence and the Bill of Rights:

"Three men," reported Johnson, "called me a Communist. One said, 'My family's with the government, it would get them in trouble. You know the FBI checks up on these things.'"

Another road Jefferson's stirring words: "Wherever any form of government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the right of the people to alter or abolish it..."

"That," remarked the man, "proceeded by reporter Johnson, 'sounds Russian to me.'"

A housewife didn't like the amendment to the constitution guaranteeing a free press and free speech.

"That part ought to be narrowed down," she said. "There's too much talk going on." She refused to sign.

Maybe Senator Joe McCarthy, who has circulated thousands of copies of his speeches through the mails at the taxpayers' expense, should circulate free copies of the Declaration of Independence instead. It might counteract some of the fear he has instilled in peoples' minds.

CRIME PROBE STYMIED

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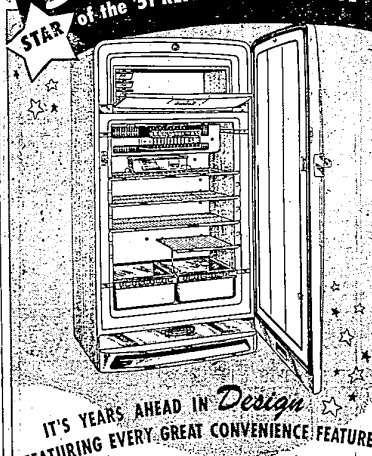
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
