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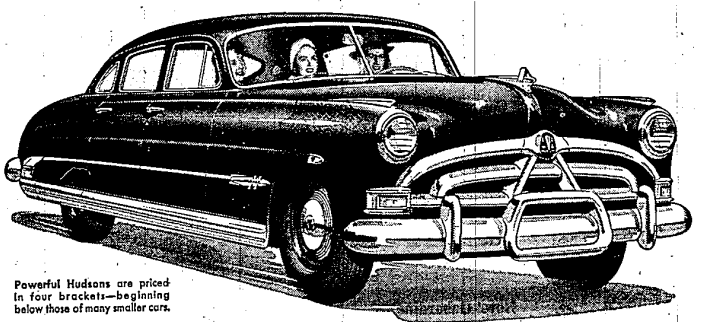
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Estimate 12,500
To Enroll At MSC

An estimated 12,500 students are expected to enroll this month for the fall term at Michigan State College, according to Kermit Smith, assistant registrar. This compares with 14,993 students enrolled in the fall term of 1950.

Breakdown of enrollment indicates that men will out-number women 8,600 to 3,900. New students and transfers will total 1,800 men and 1,200 women, Smith said.

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
