game and deer licenses has been made to the 4,000 hunting license agents in the state.

Labor Day crowds in state parks pushed 1951 attendance figures to the 12 million mark, despite unseasonably cold weather.

While the department of public instruction continues its check of school enrollment records in the state, it is revealed that the superintendents at Litchfield and North Adams schools officially have lost their licenses for padding enrollment figures to get more state aid money.

Congressman Albert J. Engle of Muskegon has refused a job as a

member of the public civil service commission. Says his holdings in Muskegon County, neglected while he was in Washington, need his attention.

Nearly 5,000 persons were killed or injured in Michigan traffic accidents during 1950. Statistics: 168 killed, 4,592 injured.

The new gasoline tax issue still is smoldering. The CIO-led Michigan Citizens committee says it has the 100,000 petition signatures to force a state referendum on the law. A lengthy court battle can be expected if and when the petitions are submitted to the state board of canvassers. The board is sure to reject them, basing the action on two previous supreme court decisions turning down attempts to force referenda on earlier gas tax increases.

Average per-capita income in Michigan has gone up to \$1,353, according to the 1950 Census. Ten years ago the average income was \$649. That means 144 per cent increase — which, incidentally, is below the national average of 150 per cent boost over the 10 years. Kansas incomes rose up 150 per cent; Arkansas, 237 per cent.

Detroit schools above elementary level soon will be teaching on the basis of drug addiction — being careful to present the instruction in a manner which could not be construed as lurid or sensational.

VA NEEDS 100 HOSPITAL AIDES AT FT. CUSTER

One hundred male hospital aides, between the ages of 18 and 52, are urgently needed at Fort Custer, Michigan, Veterans Administration Hospital, Dr. Ernest F. Jones, Manager, announced recently.

Starting salary for aides is \$2,450.00 a year for a forty-hour week, with liberal promotion possibilities. Necessary training will be given on the job. If available, quarters and meals on the hospital grounds can be arranged for single men.

Applicants must meet the necessary minimum physical requirements, be able to read and write, and qualify by personal interview. Cost of travel to hospital for interview and physical examination must be borne by applicants. All appointments will be under Federal Civil Service.

Make Sure Of Game, Expert Warns Hunters

With the hunting season approaching, David G. Steinleke, extension safety specialist at Michigan State College, recently issued some warnings to hunters.

He recalled the first day of the 1950 squirrel season. A Michigan hunter was leaning against a tree in the woods. Another hunter fired at what he thought was a squirrel. The first hunter had a doctor pick the buckshot out of his back.

Almost two-thirds of Michigan's hunting accidents are caused by humans in the line of fire, mistaking human for game and hunting with the safety catch off, Steinleke said.

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
Cottontail rabbits are the most prolific reproducers of upland game animals, with females averaging 15 youngsters per year.




