DEEP LITTER CUTS TEANING TIME IN POULTRY HOUSE

If poultry raisers want to use the deep litter system they can simply add fresh litter to the present litter in the laying house.
This idea should meet with approval because it saves the job of cleaning out the laying house, suggests J. M. Moore, extension poultry specialist at Michigan State College.

gest's J. M. Moore, extension poul-try specialist at Michigan State College.

Aside from the labor-saving angle, the deep litter system will help overcome the problem of damp lit-ter, if the poultry house is well insulated. And this well-insulated part is important, Moore says. He suggests four inches of wood shav-ings along the sidewalls and cell-ing. Or a straw loft can replace the wood shavings for celling in-sulation.

Ventilation above the ceiling insulation is important in the poultry house so the moist air can escape instead of condensing and running back down into the house.

The deep litter is built up by simply adding more litter and letting the hens mix it up with the old litter. It should be built up to about ten inches by the time cold

weather comes.

Deep litter gives off heat, making he house warmer.

Lack Of Soil Moisture Kills Trees In Winter

If everyone remembers that it's lack of soil moisture in the winter that kills many evergreens, the state will have many more live trees next spring, reports Willard Bosserman, Assistant County Agricultural Agent. Evergreens should be watered up until freezing weather. Many evergreens on the lawn receive little water even though it rains a lot, because the hard packed soil lest he water all run away. A good idea is to make small on inchi to two inch drilled holes underneath the tree or mulch with leaves, straw or pear moss. This mulch also prevents deep freezing. Newly planted stock may need some type of wind screen for exposed sites.


