"If you have't fed lambs before you'd better have a source of advice near at hand," he warned, explaining that experience in the business is invaluable for success. "You also should have a good supply of fattening feeds on hand or available. You will need about an equal poundage of grain and roughage."

Blakesiee warns: "Don't ry to push the lambs too fast at first, Give them reasonable amounts of good roughages, clean water, shalter, and case of cold or bad weater, and shalter and shalter has been always to the shalter and shalter has been always to the shalter and shalter has a shalter and the shalter has a shalter has

Vaccination by a veterinarian may be advisable in case of sore mouth or to help prevent over-feeding if you plan to turn the lambs into the corn field. The corn field over-eating problem may be eased by feeding plenty of hay close at hand.

Blakeslee advises that feeders in-restigate each death loss to de-ermine the cause. Then you'll thow how to avoid the next one.

"Hand feeding is the best prac-tice for feeding lambs. When lambs don't clean up the grain fed in 15 to 20 minutes it can be taken away to prevent over-feeding," he

Many farm workers who now have only one hand trace the loss of the other to a corn picker ac-cident. Cleaning out rollers or at-tempting to work around the picker with the power on is dangerous.


