## PINK - ALLINGTON WEDDING VOWS EXCHANGED NOV. 17

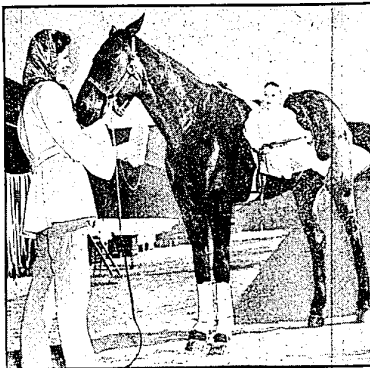

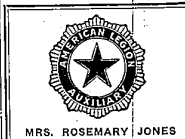

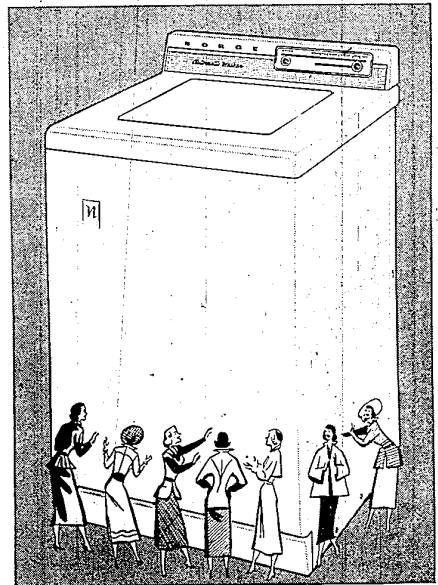
