## Gets Excellent Results With Anesthetic Drug

Dr. Eva Goddin Cutright of Wooster, Ohio, told the Pan-American Women's Alliance at Montville, Uruguay, recently that she had obtained "excellent results" with a new anesthetic drug, Suralin sodium, in more than 1,000 cases.

The U. S. anesthesiologist, who serves on the staff of the Wooster Community Hospital, said in a paper:

"This new arrival in the anesthesiology field was developed in a scientific research laboratory in order to supply an anesthetic drug which could be administered intravenously with safety and more favorable results."

Dr. Cutright added that "the facility of administration is one of the most advantageous characteristics of this drug."

She explained, "Suralin can be administered to patients of any age. It can be employed for operations of long or short duration."
