

Army Makes Use Of 4-H Club Experience

The army is making use of a former Michigan 4-H Club boy's livestock experience to fill an important position in supplying troops with meat. Howard King, Tekonsha, who won state and national honors in 4-H Club livestock production projects prior to 1948, is now serving as a meat inspector for the army.

The Branch County youth left his profitable livestock trucking business a year ago to enlist in the army. After a few months' service he applied for a post in meat inspection and because of his wide background and livestock experience was given the assignment.

Although only a corporal, King inspects meat purchased by the armed services at a packing plant.

Pontiac Production Credit Assoc. Becomes Completely Farmer Owned

The Pontiac Production Credit Association, the local co-operative credit association serving farmers in Oakland, Macomb, Livingston, Lapeer and Genesee Counties, retired the last of the government capital by presenting George S. Suen, president of Production Credit Corporation of St. Paul, with a giant sized check for \$5,000.00 at its annual meeting Wednesday, December 5.

Back in 1933-34 the federal government helped the production credit association of the nation to get started by providing most of the capital. The balance was obtained from the farmers themselves who invested in the capital stock of their local co-operative credit associations when they borrowed money to finance their production and operating costs.

The production credit associations were organized to provide farmers with a source of credit adapted to their special needs. They are not solely dependent upon local funds. Most of the money is obtained from private investors.


With all the current emphasis on grass silage, I'd like to point out the differences between grass silage and corn silage. There are some points to keep in mind when changing over to the silo with legume or legume-grass mixture in it. In short, hay crop silage is lower in total digestible nutrients and especially in net energy than well-cared corn silage on a dry matter basis. That's because corn silage contains a large amount of grain. This difference may be largely offset by the fact that most hay crop silage has higher protein content than corn silage does. Less protein supplement therefore is needed when legume silage is fed. Often no protein supplement is required when hay silage is fed.

Because grass or legume is lower in energy than corn silage and not energy on a dry matter basis than well-cared corn silage, it may be necessary to feed higher producing cows a little more grain with grass or legume silage.

Take good care of these eggs. Oftentimes egg quality is poorer in the winter than in the summer. Of main importance to keep good quality eggs is to store them in cool rooms with a relatively high humidity or dampness in the air. Basement rooms tend to dry out once the furnace is started.

New Raspberry Plant Grown At South Haven

A new red raspberry variety, named Early Red, has been developed at Michigan State College's South Haven Experiment Station after twenty years of breeding and testing.

Stanley Johnston, MSC horticulturist and superintendent of the station, reports that the early maturing season of Early Red is of particular value because the early season red raspberry crop is usually smaller and brings higher prices.

Plants of Early Red are upright, all, vigorous, hardy and very productive. Berries mature early and are light red when first ripe, turning rather dark when fully ripe. This is important, Johnston points out, as the berries are easy to pick while firm and harvesting can be done before the berries are too soft and too dark in color.

Since 1931 when the first cross was made, Early Red has gone through a long testing period at the South Haven station and a ten-year commercial test in the raspberry producing area near Benton Harbor.

Early Red withstands the canning process very well without crumbling. It freezes as well as Latham, the leading commercial red raspberry.

Hesperia Claims Oldest Hunter With 92-Year-Old

Topping the bid of a 91 year old Owasco man for the title of Michigan's oldest active hunter is Samuel L. Gigg, Hesperia.

Born on the Fourth of July over 92 years ago, Newsgo friends advise the conservation department he has been a licensed hunter ever since the permit was first required in 1895.
