tion will be necessary if this type of program is to be carried out. It is expected that plans will be made for the starting of first aid classes in the community as well as auxiliary police and fire training. Through the cooperation of the Farmington Township School District, plans are being made for the holding of a blood typing clinic in February. The program is being coordinated through the local civil defense organization. The community also has a tested and efficient air spotter organization which is separate from the civil defense council.

proposed elementary schools and the high school addition. The Board has already indicated that the first project to be started under the new building program will be a 13 classroom elementary school to be constructed in the southeast section of the District. The other two units include a seven classroom elementary school to be built in the northwest section of the district and the addition to the high school building on Middlebelt Road just south of Eight Mile Road. The entire \$700,000 bond issue approved by the voters at a special election held October 29 will be sold if permission is granted by the Michigan Finance Commission. It is hoped that construction work on the building program can be started this spring.
