### 96 YEAR OLD IS OLDEST ACTIVE DEER HUNTER

Being alone in years does not prevent a number of Michigan citizens from continuing to enjoy hunting.

The oldest active deer hunter in the recent season, the conservation department reports, appears to be 96-year-old Luther Moody of Ewart. Moody advised Charles Welch, a department regional supervisor, that he failed to score this year, however.

When the department invited the older but still spry outdoorsmen to compete for the honorary title of Michigan's oldest active hunter, it received inquiries from several 50-year-old gentlemen.

Second oldest active hunter which the department has been able to confirm is 53-year-old Edwin D. Brown of Jackson. Brown will be 54 in February, 1952. Brown, who spent his early days as a U. S. marshal in the west, started hunting when he was 16.

Others, alone in years but still active hunters in the November season, were Samuel L. Giggy, 52, of Hesperia, and George W. Ginter, 51, of Owosso.

### Release Greater Number Of Trout This Year

Smaller hatchery operational losses and some increased trout production permitted the conservation department to release over 3,022,000 trout in inland waters as compared to 2,211,000 last year.

State hatcheries reared and released 1,301,000 legal size trout, about 41,600 more than in 1950. Other plantings were some 1,566,000 fingerlings, twice as many as before, and 165,000 sub-legal trout, a slight increase.

As customary, northern lower peninsula trout lakes and streams received the bulk of the year's crop, 1,520,000 trout. Stocked in upper peninsula waters were 1,165,600 and the remainder were released in the southern third of the state locations.
