# U-M Tuition To Rise 5 Per Cent

ANN ARBOR University of Michigan tuition may increase approximately five per cent for 1972-73 to meet the gap between anticipated state appropriations and U-M needs, the Regents have decided.

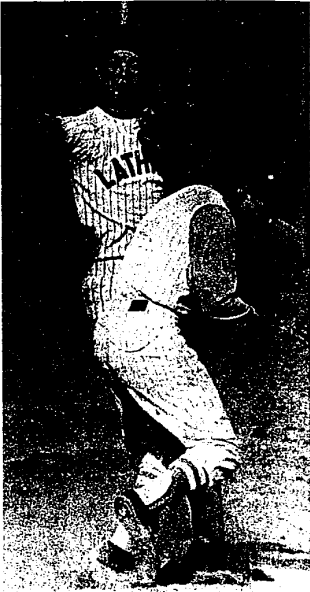
Undergraduate tuition for Michigan residents will be \$898 next year, compared to \$650 currently. Non-resident undergraduate tuition, which now is \$2,140 would be \$2,260 annually.

Tuition at U-M - Dearborn and U-M - Flint will remain at \$56 for undergraduates and \$60 for graduate students.

Other student fees for Michigan residents for 1972-73 include: graduate school \$840 (now \$800); law \$250 (now \$200); medicine and dentistry \$1,260 (now \$1,160), and public health \$1,220 (now \$1,160).

Non-resident student fees for the 1972-73 academic year include: graduate school \$2,360 (now \$2,240); law \$2,400 (now \$2,300); public health \$2,500 (now \$2,400), and medicine and dentistry \$2,540 (now \$2,400).

Allan F. Smith, U-M vice-president for academic affairs, in requesting the regents' contingent approval of the student fee increase, referred to his statement at the March regents meeting that a \$3,200,000 gap exists.
