Smolek, former village president of Wood Creek Farms, is a candidate for the May 16 election which will elect nine commissioners and decide the cityhood question. "I would work for strong charter zoning provisions that would protect the present residential character of our community. I would also seek realistic limitations on millage to protect property owners."

"I believe charter restrictions can be written to protect the taxpayer in many areas presently controlled by the elected officials in our neighboring communities."

SMOLEK, president and owner of Air-Matic Products Co. Inc., of Southfield, had

served seven years on Wood Creek's council.

He is a past director and now a monarch of the University Lions Club, is on an advisory board of the American Ordinance Assoc., member of the Farmington Elks and has served in various capacities with the Farmington Board of Education, United Foundation, Junior Achievement, Wood Creek Farms Civic Assoc., and church groups.

Permission was also given Farmington VFW Post 4033 to conduct its Poppy Sale May 18-20 to benefit hospitalized veterans of foreign wars.

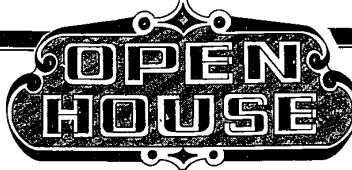
FJH Concert Is Friday
