

Wallace Rally Set In F'ton

Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace will start his primary campaigning in Oberverland with a rally on May 8 in Farmington's Harrison High School, 2995 W. 12 Mile, at 3:30 p.m.

Wallace, who kicked off his Michigan campaign before an enthusiastic crowd on April 15, is also scheduled to appear at a rally in Lansing that day.

Wallace's showing in the May 16 primary is expected to be an indicator of his national appeal and support in industrial northern states.

Griffin; and Helen Milliken, wife of Michigan Gov. William G. Milliken.

Sheldon B. Smith, chairman of the Republican Committee of Oakland County, said invitations to the \$100 per couple fund-raising event had been mailed to "our most active Republican families in the county."

More than 500 chamber members and guests will travel to St. Croix in the Virginia Islands and board the Cunard Adventurer for the cruise to Wilmington, N.C.

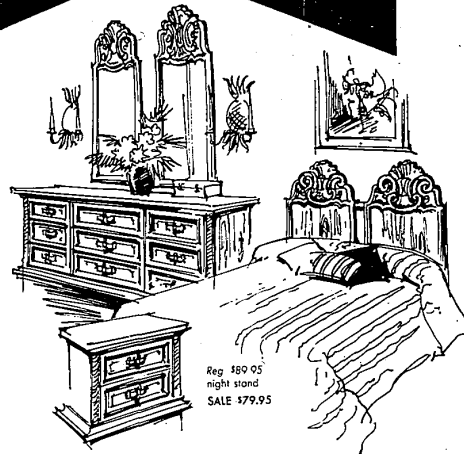
