

Another Scholarship Added By PTA Council

FARMINGTON
Recipients of three \$300 G.V. Harrison scholarships will be announced and given their awards at the Farmington Area PTA Council's final meeting of the year Wednesday, May 17, at 8 p.m. in the Farmington Junior High School library.

Mrs. Rosalie Trent, council scholarship chairman, will make the presentations to a senior from each graduating class at the Farmington Public Schools' three high schools: Farmington, North Farmington and Harrison. The scholarships are named in honor of Gerald V. Harrison, former superintendent of Farmington Schools.

MRS. TRENT comments: "Due to generous contributions from the local PTA's which maintain the scholarship program, and also to the overwhelming community response to the movie show sponsored by the council this winter to raise additional funds, we are able to recog-

nize a worthy student at each of our three high schools. In the past only two grants were made to Farmington and North Farmington. Since Harrison High is graduating its first class this year, we are gratified we can make a similar award there also."
