

Board To Decide On Directorship

The resignation of Joseph Nicita, director of secondary education for Farmington Public Schools, will be effective June 30. The board formally accepted his resignation Tuesday while offering him their "congratulations and very best wishes."

"I am particularly unhappy to report this on behalf of the district," said Richard Peters, board president. "Of course we are happy that he has been able to achieve a superintendent's position in the area of Jackson."

Supt. Roderick J. Smith concurred: "We are never

happy to lose one of our important personnel." Smith said Nicita came to the district in 1966 and has since worked in curriculum development, as a line administrator, and in developing plans for the fifth junior high.

No decision has been made on whether Nicita will be replaced, according to Smith. "We are carefully studying this, but we have to recognize that budget cuts will affect administrative personnel as well as the teaching staff."

Smith said he expected that a decision would be made by the next board meeting on June 6. "There is no question

that we feel we need him," he continued. "Our choice would be to replace him immediately if possible."

CONSTRUCTION, bidding and agreements filled the remainder of the meeting. The board called a special

meeting for 8 p.m. on Tuesday, May 23, in the board offices on Shilawasee. Under discussion will be the construction management contract for the fifth junior high school.

Eight to 10 houses built today are of wood frame design.

Lottery, Busing Questions Pass

As expected, Farmington Township residents voted overwhelmingly Tuesday in favor of a constitutional amendment banning cross district busing and a legislative moratorium barring courts from implementing any busing plans. On the moratorium busing advisory question, township residents cast 10,499 yes votes and 2,285 no votes.

On the busing amendment question, residents cast 11,138 yes votes and 2,203 no votes. Surprisingly, the state ballot proposal to authorize a lottery was more popular among voters than the busing moratorium advisory question.

On State Proposal A, authorizing a lottery, township residents approved it by a margin of 10,698 to 9,558. State Proposal B, requiring state legislators to resign before seeking another office, the township vote was 6,516 yes and 6,229 no.

Township residents voted to re-enact the franchise with Detroit Edison Co. to furnish the area with electricity by a vote of 8,309 to 3,389.

City residents approved State Proposal A by a 2,665 to 563 vote margin and State Proposal B by a 1,626 to 1,524 margin.


