Absentee Ballots Ready

Clarenceville School District residents who wish to secure absentee ballots for the June 12 school board election may do so by either writing or calling the Board of Education office, 2830 W. Eight Mile Road, Farmington, 48024. Those telephoning should request to speak with Mrs. Geraldine Kelly.

Absentee ballots should be ready for distribution by May 30. The board office will remain open on Saturday, June 10, from 8 a.m. until 2 p.m. to receive absentee voters.

Eight persons, including one incumbent, have filed for two seats on the Board. The incumbent is Raymond Chaiken, a 12-year veteran on the board.

Others seeking four-year terms are Mrs. Sharon May, Mrs. Marilyn Rowens, Thomas Taaffe, Gary R. Serlin, Mrs. Gertrude Walsh, Roy Whitener and Richard J. Wood. Wood is a former member of the Board, having served two terms from 1962-70.

Lawrence Kopelman, previously announced as a ninth candidate, did not file a nominating petition.

Gymnast Program Planned

Clarenceville High School again this summer will conduct an instructional gymnastics program. The program is designed to give instruction in gymnastics to boys and girls from age six and older.

Included in the courses will be beginning tumbling, advanced beginning tumbling, intermediate tumbling, trampolines, boys' apparatus, girls' apparatus, ballet for gymnastics and team workouts. Boys and girls will be placed into classes according to age and ability.

The summer program will consist of three two-week sessions with each class meeting for one hour Monday through Friday for the two week period. Registration fee is \$7 for each course per two-week session. Students need not be residents of the Clarenceville School District. Classes will be filled on a first come first serve basis.

Registration will be held at Clarenceville High School in the gym lobby between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday, June 3, and Saturday, June 10. Summer sessions will be June 19-30; July 3-14; and July 17-28.

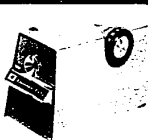
