Gun Safety Hints Given

FARMINGTON There is still an opportunity for Farmington area residents to sign up for a Home Firearms Safety Course to be taught at Farmington Township Hall from 7-9 p.m. Wednesday, May 31.

The course, sponsored by the Farmington Area Jaycees, is designed to give the knowledge and skill needed to avoid firearms accidents in the home.

Knowledge of guns and ammunition, safe handling and storage, and actual handling exercises, are among the topics to be covered. No firing will be done in the course.

The class is open to all persons over 12 years of age, both male and female. Cost of the course is \$2 each and will cover materials to be used.

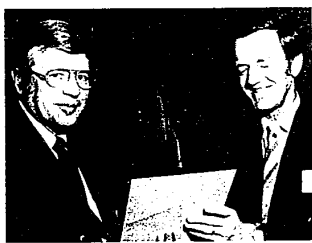
Instructor is Jaycee Arthur Dittmar Jr., a certified NRA home firearms instructor, with assistance from officers of city and township police departments.


