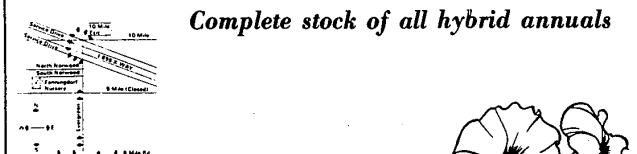
**SUMMER SWIM REGISTRATION**

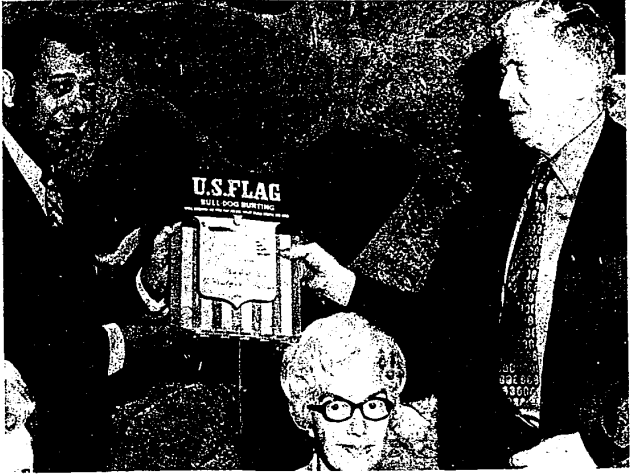
