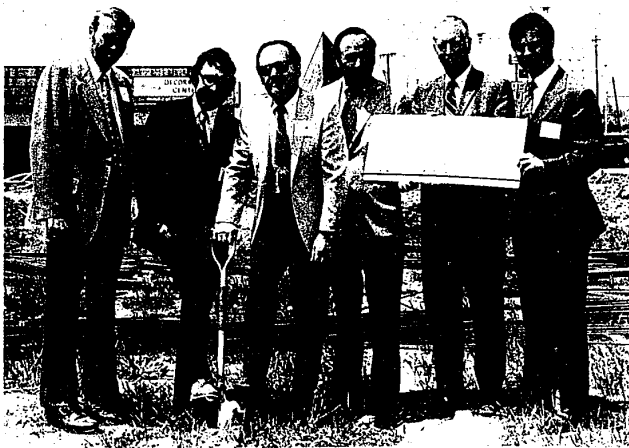
REGISTRATIONS will be accepted from 9 a.m. to noon on June 3, at the location the applicant plans to attend. Fees for open swimming will be 25 cents for students and 50 cents for adults. Fees for each two week instructional swimming session will be \$8 per student. Instructional swimming sessions are scheduled for June 19-30, July 10-21, July 24-August 4 and August 7-18.

CLASSES are organized according to capability levels during each session.

Instructional levels one - five will be taught during all four sessions at the following times: 9-9:55 a.m., 10-10:55 a.m., and 11-11:55 a.m. Levels six-ten will be taught from noon-12:55 p.m. during all four sessions.

Open swimming - will be offered from 1-2 p.m. and 2-3 p.m., Monday - Friday, and from 6:30-7:45 p.m. and 7:45-9 p.m., Monday - Thursday. Children attending instructional swimming must be of such a height that their chins measure 38 inches from the floor. During open swimming, children who aren't of minimum height must be accompanied by an adult.

Suits and towels are to be furnished by the participants, and residents will be given priority in the classes.

Theater Will Locate At Industrial Park

FARMINGTON Groundbreaking ceremonies were held Tuesday for the Farmington 4 Cinemas, a completely automated fourplex theater.

The theater is being built in the Freeway Shopping Center at the Thompson-Brown Farmington Freeway Industrial Park, 10 Mile just west of the I-96 Grand River exit.

The building will be located on a site west of the Holiday Inn and immediately east of the shopping center complex which includes Park Place restaurant, Grimes Cleaners, Be Lynn Coiffeurs and Milo's Decorating Center.

COMPLETION is scheduled for September, according to Sol Krim, president of Krim Theatrical Enterprises of Southfield.

It will be one of the first new theaters in the state to provide continental seating. There will be a center bank of seats only with aisles on each side against the walls. Krim, a third generation theater entrepreneur, says the aisles will be wider and more steeply pitched to eliminate viewing obstructions "regardless of how high the hair is on the lady sitting in front of you."

FARMINGTON 4 Cinemas

will accommodate about 1,000 patrons in its four separate "mid-sized" auditoriums located on either side of a common lobby.

The theater will house projectors that employ lamps in place of the old carbon units, instant automatic switching from one projector to another, and full one-hour reels rather than the outdated 20-minute reels.

With the opening of this and a new Triplex Theater near completion in the Brighton Mall, Krim Theatrical Enterprises will become actively involved in the exhibition phase of the business. For the past 12 years, they have been

primarily landlords rather than theater operators.

DESIGNED by Robert B. Alpern Associates, architects-planners of Birmingham, the \$600,000 theater is being constructed by Bernard Cronk, general contractor of Oak Park. Interior decorating will be by Dee Finsilver and Shirley Pollack.

Located in the Freeway Shopping Center, the complex will provide parking for almost 700 cars.

The shopping center, developed by the Novi Holding Co., presently has only three units still available for occupancy. Among other firms neighboring the theater include Parkway Auto Supply, Farmington Sports Center, Warren Eye Clinic, a barber shop and McGraw Travel, Inc. The \$2 million service center, developed by Novi Bonding Co., services both the general public and more than 40 industrial and commercial firms located in the Farmington Freeway Industrial Park, Michigan's first "Class A" state certified industrial park.
