Methodists' Annual Meet June 7-10

Clergy and lay delegates representing 176,000 United Methodist Church members in eastern Michigan and the Upper Peninsula will gather for the 131st session of the Detroit Conference in Adrian June 7 to 10.

Major items for consideration will be "Key 72," an ecumenical evangelistic thrust involving 100 denominations, and a 1973 budget of \$4-million.

Women's rights, the place of youth in the church and minority groups also will come up for discussion among the 1,000 delegates.

Wednesday afternoon, June 7, Key 72 will be subject of a report from a task force headed by the Rev. Howard B. Childs of Beverly Hills. It is a movement designed to reveal the Christian life style and to show the meaning of the Christian message in our times.

The new budget represents an increase of 1.94 per cent over the 1972 budget. It was, however, pared down from an increase of 8.7 per cent by various agencies, boards and committees of the conference.

THE CONFERENCE also is expected to adjust programs and ministries to follow the mandate of the recent world Methodist conference in Atlanta which removed from the church's "Discipline and Rules of Order" discriminatory masculine phraseology and eliminated age requirements for service on church boards.

The annual conference will be divided into 10 study sections to consider in depth the programming and legislative recommendations from the General Conference and thus draw up the 1973 program for the 564 churches in the Detroit Conference.
